



Rio Olympic Games

Super Hi-Vision Public Viewing Events and Free Viewing at NHK

Tokyo, July 7, 2016- NHK will hold 8K (Super Hi-Vision) Public Viewings in six venues in Japan, as well as on the ground in Rio de Janeiro in cooperation with the Brazilian Broadcaster, TV Globo. In Rio, 8K experimental terrestrial transmission will be conducted.

Opening and Closing Ceremonies and five events (Judo, Swimming, Athletics, Basketball and Men's Football final) in 8K resolution will be broadcast, which produced jointly with the Olympic Broadcasting Services (OBS), and some of them will be broadcast live.

The world's finest images and audio will give viewers a sense of what it is like to be present in the stadiums of the world's foremost sporting event.
