### Grammar Tips

#### ① Adjective + SÔ (It seems \_)

◆ Adding SÔ after an adjective allows you to talk about what you think or guess, after you look at or listen to something.

◆ When you add SÔ onto I-adjectives, you change I at the end to SÔ.

I-adjectives : OMOSHIROI (interesting) ⇒ OMOSHIROSÔ (seem interesting)

NA-adjectives : HIMA (free) ⇒ HIMASÔ (seem to be free)

#### ② \_ WA CHOTTO ... (\_ is/are a little bit ...)

◆ You can say this to decline a proposal, in a soft, indirect way, without directly voicing disapproval.

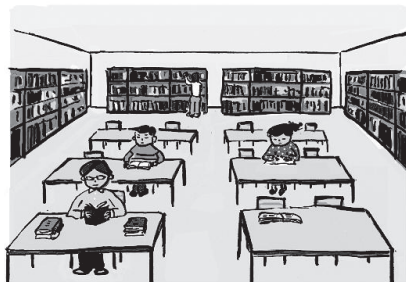
