アンナ Anna	アニメの曲です。 ANIME NO KYOKU DESU.	Songs from animation.



Grammar Tips

① ARIMASU

◆ In Lesson 7, ARIMASU meant "something exists." In Lesson 9, it meant "an event that is held." In this lesson, ARIMASU has a meaning of "having something" such as experiences, time or opportunities.

② TA-form verb + KOTO GA ARIMASU (Have an experience of _)

◆ If we combine TA-form verbs and KOTO GA ARIMASU, we can talk about our experiences, namely what we have done before.

e.g.) WATASHI WA SHINJUKU NI ITTA KOTO GA ARIMASU. (I have been to Shinjuku.)

↳ TA-form of IKIMASU (to go)
