Grammar Tips

① NAI-form of verbs Verbs : See pp.54, 55

◆ The verbs that conjugate, ending with NAI, are called "NAI-form verbs."

They are the casual-negative verbs.

e.g.)	TABEMASU	(to eat)	⇒	TABENAI	(not to eat)
	OKIMASU	(to get up)	⇒	OKINAI	(not to get up)
	IKIMASU	(to go)	⇒	IKANAI	(not to go)
	TSUKAIMASU	(to use)	⇒	TSUKAWANAI	(not to use)
	KIMASU	(to come)	⇒	KONAI	(not to come)

② IIE, SOREHODODEMO (No, not really.)

◆ IIE is a negative answer. SOREHODODEMO means "not really."

◆ IIE, SOREHODODEMO is an expression you use to be humble and modest.
