Grammar Tips

① **NAI-form verb + DE KUDASAI** (Please don't \_)

◆ If you add DE KUDASAI to the NAI-form of verb, you are telling somebody not to do something.

e.g.) IKANAI DE KUDASAI. (Please don't go.)

↳ NAI-form of IKIMASU (to go)

② **Words to indicate time points**

KINÔ (yesterday)	---	KYÔ (today)	---	ASHITA (tomorrow)
SENSHÛ (last week)	---	KONSHÛ (this week)	---	RAISHÛ (next week)
SENGETSU (last month)	---	KONGETSU (this month)	---	RAIGETSU (next month)
