アンナ Anna	あっ、私だ。 A', WATASHI DA.	Oh, that's me.
けんた Kenta	驚いた?あとで、アンナさんにあげます。 ODOROITA? ATODE, ANNA-SAN NI AGEMASU.	Are you surprised? Later, I'll give it to you, Anna.
アンナ Anna	写真をくれるんですか。うれしいです。 SHASHIN O KURERU N DESU KA? URESHII DESU.	Are you going to give me the photo? I'm glad.



Grammar Tips

① AGEMASU

- ◆ When the speaker gives something to the listener, the speaker says AGEMASU (to give).
AGEMASU is also used, when people generally give something to others.

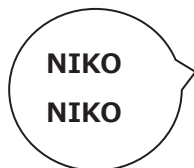


② KUREMASU

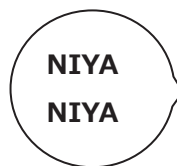
- ◆ If somebody gives you something, you use KUREMASU (to give).
- ◆ In Japanese, different verbs are used, depending on whether you are speaking from the perspective of the giver or the receiver.
