Grammar Tips

① **OTANJÔBI OMEDETÔ** (Happy Birthday)

♦ OTANJÔBI is "a birthday." OMEDETÔ is "congratulations."
Expressed politely ⇒ OTANJÔBI OMEDETÔ GOZAIMASU. (Happy Birthday.)

② **MORAIMASU** (to be given/to get)

- When the receiver is the subject, you use MORAIMASU. Use the particle NI to indicate the giver.
 e.g.) KANOJO WA KARE NI FÛSEN O MORAIMASU. (She is given a balloon by him.)
- $\ensuremath{\diamond}$ When the giver is the subject, you use AGEMASU (to give).




e.g.) KARE WA KANOJO NI FÛSEN O AGEMASU.

(He gives her a balloon.)
