Grammar Tips

① _ GA ARIMASU (There is/are _)

- ◆ GA is the particle that comes after a noun, which indicates the subject of a sentence. Essentially, GA is used to introduce a person or a thing into the conversation for the first time.
- ◆ ARIMASU is a verb indicating that some things are there.
e.g.) KÊKI GA ARIMASU. (There is a cake.)

② TSU : a counter for things like cakes Counters : See p.53

- ◆ If followed by the counter TSU, the way we count numbers from one to ten changes.
