Grammar Tips

① **NI NARIMASU** (to be/to become _)

◆ NI is a particle indicating the result of a change.

e.g.) NIHONGO KYÔSHI NI NARIMASU. (I will become a Japanese language teacher.)

② **Plain-form verb + NO : Change verbs into nouns**

◆ To change verbs into nouns, you add NO to the plain forms of verbs, such as the dictionary form or the TA-form.

e.g.) NIHONGO-KYÔSHI NI NARU NO GA YUME DESU.

↳ Dictionary form of NARIMASU (to be)

(To be a Japanese language teacher is my dream.)

◆ You can also use KOTO, instead of NO.

e.g.) NIHONGO-KYÔSHI NI NARU KOTO GA YUME DESU.
