Grammar Tips

① TE-form verbs (1) Basic pattern Verbs : See pp.54, 55

- ◆ When we use verbs in the middle of sentences, we use their conjugated forms.
- ◆ The conjugated verbs ending with TE or DE, are called "TE-form verbs."

To turn MASU-form verbs into TE-form verbs, the basic pattern is just to change MASU to TE.

e.g.) OBOEMASU (to memorize) ⇒ OBOETE



② TE-form verb + KUDASAI (Please do _)

- ◆ When you ask somebody to do something in Japanese, you say TE-form verbs and then KUDASAI (please).

e.g.) OBOEMASU + KUDASAI = OBOETE KUDASAI (Please memorize)
